Dr Mira Leigh graduated from London University (now Imperial College) in 1973. Her training included house jobs at Charing Cross Hospital and the West London Hospital. Dr Leigh started her paediatric training at Westminster Children's Hospital (WCH), where she subsequently became a registrar and resident medical officer. Her neonatal training was undertaken at the Whittington Hospital, London. Dr Leigh undertook further registrar training at St George's Hospital, London, which included community paediatric training. She became senior registrar and subsequently lecturer at Charing Cross Hospital.

At WCH, Dr Leigh was involved with the programme for bone marrow transplant patients, as well as general and neonatal paediatrics and paediatric cardiology. She also worked at the Royal Marsden Hospital, Sutton, as a clinical research fellow. As such, she was the bone marrow transplant coordinator, paediatric registrar and liaised with microbiology.

Appointed as a consultant at Bedford Hospital in 1985, Dr Leigh was a member of the planning committee for the building and setting up of the Cygnet Wing. She is involved with teaching medical students currently from Cambridge University (previously UCL) as well as paramedics, and is an advanced paediatric life support instructor.
